

## Mounting the lens module

### ESD safety instructions

The rules for handling ESD-sensitive components are to be observed like e. g. by wearing ESD-protective clothes and shoes.

Board-level cameras are especially sensitive to electrostatic discharge. Make sure to avoid mechanical or electrical damage of the printed circuit board or its connections.

- Do not touch the printed circuit board while it is powered.
- Always hold the board by the edges to avoid the risk of electrostatic discharge damage.

### Ambient conditions

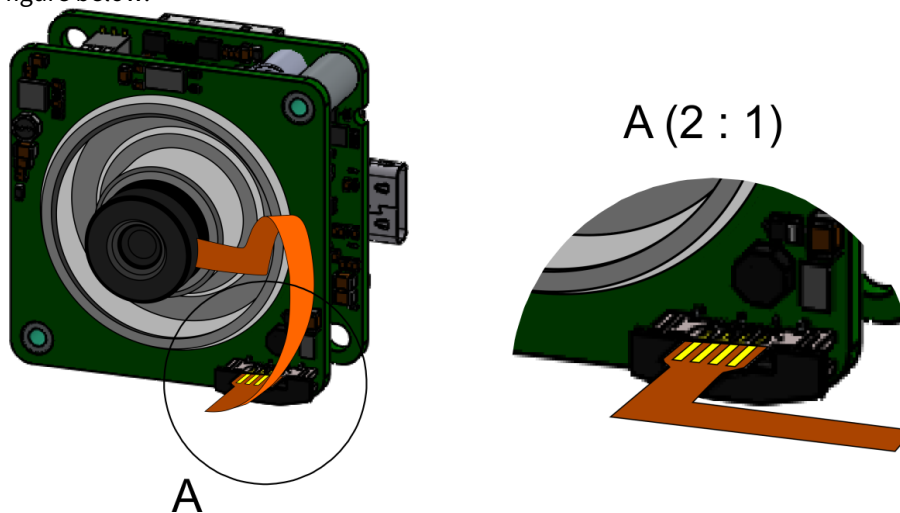
**NOTICE!**

The following table applies only to the lens module. Also observe the camera's ambient conditions when using or storing the module with the camera.

<b>Temperature during operation</b>	-30 °C ... 85 °C -22 °F ... 185 °F
<b>Temperature during storage</b>	-40 °C ... 85 °C -40 °F ... 185 °F

### How to mount the lens module

1. Make sure, that the camera is disconnected from the PC (camera is not powered).
2. Insert and screw the lens module until it stops.
3. At the camera, open the connector for the flex cable of the lens module by pulling off the black cap, see figure below.

4. Plug the flex cable of the lens module into the connector so that the contacts show inward.
5. Fasten the connector by closing the black cap.
6. Connect the camera to the PC (camera is powered).
7. Open the camera in uEye Cockpit.
8. Via the "uEye > Properties" menu, open the settings for the camera parameters.
9. In the "Focus" tab, you should be able to adjust the focus of the lens module.
